



PARKING RULES

PERMIT & ACCESS

- LAU parking lots are restricted to vehicles with valid LAU permits only.
- Vehicles with valid permits may use the parking lots within the specified hours and days of operation, as indicated by signage.
- No vehicles are allowed to stay overnight in the parking lots without special authorization (except for authorized residence halls' students)
- No vehicle will be allowed to enter the campus and/or the parking lots without a valid parking sticker.
- Parking permits/stickers should be affixed on the windshield-driver side and kept clearly visible.
- Parking permits are non-transferable.

RULES

- Vehicles should be orderly and attentively parked in their designated spots only.
- Parking is prohibited in restricted areas and where indicated by signage.
- Drivers are expected to respect all signage and rules in the parking lots.
- Drivers are expected to comply with Protection Office staff instructions at all times.
- Maximum speed limit on campus is 15 km/h unless otherwise indicated.
- Blocking entrances to buildings, driveways and fire-safety components is prohibited.
- LAU assumes no liability for theft or damages to vehicles parked on campus premises.
- Drivers are responsible for familiarizing themselves with current parking rules and regulations.
- LAU encourages the use of Fuel Efficient/Low Emitting (FELE) vehicles (visit www.greenercars.org or contact Physical Plant at extension 2020 for more info)

VIOLATIONS

- Parking tickets will be issued for breaking parking rules and regulations.
- Habitual or flagrant disregard of rules and regulations is grounds for cancellation of a parking permit or stronger action by the university.
- Any parking permit will be automatically cancelled if the permit holder is issued more than two violations/tickets per semester.
- All parking tickets must be paid to the Business Office cashier within 10 business days to avoid further penalties.
- Vehicles that are improperly parked and/or compromising general safety are subject to being towed at the owner's expense.
